## From Malcom and Sandy Potter, World Outreach, Chiang Mai

There are three possible areas where the ET team may be involved.



Baan Faa Mai Girls' Home continues to accommodate, nurture and disciple hilltribe teenagers who are at various stages of completing 6 years of secondary school at Mae Chaem government high school (800m from BFM). Under the blessed leadership of Narayt and Or, the girls are discipled and learn various lifeskills. Most have

lived all their lives in a mountain village hut or basic wooden house surrounded by steep jungle and fields.

Mae Chem is about 2hours travel by ute, from Chiang Mai. Baan Faa Mai provides a spring board to tertiary education. In a safe environment they receive food, accommodation and daily loving care from national hostel staff. Growing in Christ is an important part of hostel life and most students become committed disciples of Christ with a strong desire to serve God.

Baan Piemrak is a hostel in Chiang Mai that provides accommodation for 8 female tertiary students. They are often students who have been part of life at Baan Faa Mai.

Peter and Suatlee Chong, in Chiang Mai, continue to expand their work with disadvantaged migrant Shan children, youth and their families. Connections are made initially with the children through a school where Peter and Suatlee teach English. Pater and Suatlee have a busy schedule with helping these precious children with extra school subject tuition, meeting practical needs, outreach and discipleship.
