Peter Cheyne works part-time at East Taieri Church. He has had a long-term interest in understanding and implementing disciple-making in the local church. East Taieri is currently reinventing its disciple-making.



Gareth Bruce is Associate Pastor at East Taieri. He is leading the exploration of small groups as a key element in making disciples and forming thinking around the potential for this to inform and shape leadership models in the future.



Stu Crosson has been leading Anglican churches in New Zealand since 1999 and is currently the Senior Minister at Hope Church, Dunedin. Stu is passionate about teaching the gospel as revealed in the bible and raising up the next generation of Jesus followers.

Ever noticed how easily song lyrics stick in your memory? Even song lyrics you don't want to remember! Many of us will remember the Scripture in Song movement, and still have nuggets of Scripture buried in our hearts as a result.

Over the last two years, **Malcolm Gordon** has been writing a song a week from the Scriptures, as a way of keeping company with the text, and allowing the text to keep company with him. Six months ago he began a monthly Night Chapel, inviting others to learn the songs, and let God speak through them. At SI Ministry Conference, Malcolm will offer a workshop teaching the songs and exploring the ways they help with Christian formation and discipleship. Attendees will receive a resource and access to recordings.
